In the 2015-2016 school year, Sherwood Heights Elementary students demonstrated academic achievement and social/emotional advancement. Due to new legislation, the Every Child Succeeds Act, passed earlier this year, the requirements changed so there is no statewide designation for schools this year. However, students at Sherwood scored consistently with Oregon School Average performance in both reading, mathematics and science.

Students receive direct and explicit instruction from highly qualified instructors in core subject areas. Reading is provided through a "Walk to Read" format which allows students to receive specialized instruction that meets their individual needs. Interventions are implemented for all students who do not meet their grade level's proficiency level. Mathematics, writing and other subjects are taught with fidelity using research based curriculum.

As parents and family members, you play a vital role in the success of your children's education. Active participation in our school activities and as a volunteer is highly encouraged and helps your child value their education, teachers and school. Ensuring that children are at school every day will allow them the opportunity to receive instruction and learn. 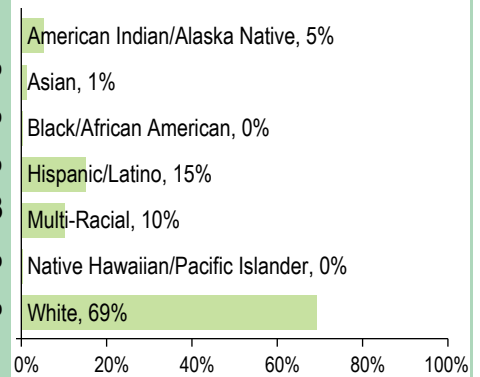

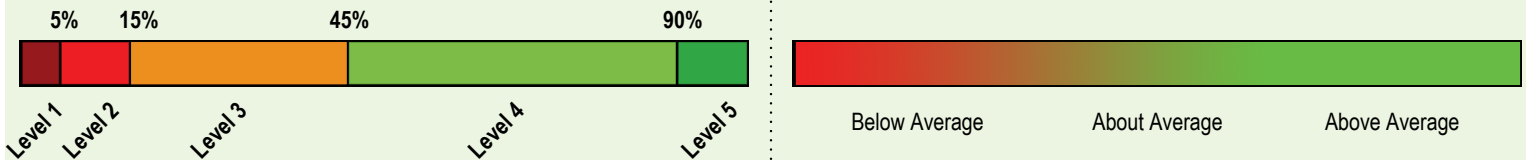
